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
THE ITALIAN LEATHER RESEARCH INSTITUTE

In this context of artisanal tradition and commitment to excellence, proudly presents the exhibition "The Glove School: art and culture of artisanal production".

The Italian Leather Research Institute (SSIP) has accompanied the glove industry since its origins and is established in Naples with funding from the State and local authorities, as the Royal Research Institute for the Leather Industry. It was established by Royal Decree on February 8th, 1885, No. 1596, with the task of "providing technical and practical guidance for professional operators of the various glove's industry branches, and conducting testing and research in the field of tanning, leather dyeing and dyestuffs".

The exhibition offers a fascinating glimpse into the past and future of the glove making art, celebrating the legacy of the Italian Leather Research Institute (SSIP), which now serves as the national research organization of the Chambers of Commerce of Naples, North-West Tuscany, and Vicenza. The mission is to support all Italian companies in the tanning sector through research and development activities, training, product and process certification, analysis, controls, and consultancy.

The Italian Leather Research Institute (SSIP) has its headquarter at Olivetti District at Via Campi Flegrei, 34, Pozzuoli (NA). In addition, there are various branch offices: Industrial District of Santa Croce sull'Arno (PI) at POTECO and at Via del Lavoro, 22 in Industrial District of Arzignano.

It stems from the aim to create a synergistic network among the Italian Leather Research Institute, the Industrial Union of Naples, LINEAPELLE, and various specialized Neapolitan companies in the leather and glove industry.

Each company, with its specific expertise, collaborates to promote the history and tradition of Neapolitan high-quality leather glove production, elevating the reputation of Naples as the "Glove Capital".


EXHIBITION

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THE EXHIBITION reveals the long tradition of the Italian Leather Research Institute, and aims to highlight the cultural heritage related to innovation and the art of tanning.

The goal is to promote common awareness of the artisanal craftsmanship of gloves, celebrating the connection between the founding of the Italian Leather Research Institute and the influence of glove-makers in 1885.



The exhibition, in addition to weaving the web of excellence of Neapolitan fashion in the world, vigorously underlines that Neapolitan glove makers are not only guardians of a long tradition, but represent an excellence of Made in Italy on the international scene.

The exhibition thus represents a significant contribution to discussion and development of the sector, aiming to keep this artisan tradition alive in the contemporary context.



The intent is to develop the rich tradition of the Italian Leather Research Institute, and to draw attention to the two centuries old glove art companies and leather goods, with the support of LINEAPELLE and the Chiroteca business network.

The exhibition is configured as a celebration of innovation; through the exposure of innovative projects, in fact it manages to convey the dynamism and modernity that permeate the sector glove, demonstrating how ancient techniques integrate harmoniously with the challenges and opportunities of the contemporary world.



Another fundamental aspect of the exhibition is the promotion of training in the art of glove making.


The Glove School aims to feed and perpetuate craftsmanship, ensuring that traditional skills are not lost over time.
